Superintendent's Report

Financial Report

Dr. Steggall reported on the May 2021 revenues and expenses. She also reviewed the June 2021 Yearend balances in Fund 1 and Fund 4. Dr. Steggall stated that the district is in good standing and that no ESSER II dollars have been requested in the 20/21 school year.

# Facilities Update

Dr. Steggall updated the board on the high school roof project, Triad is expected on site this week. The siding repair is also included in the roof bid project. Dr. Steggall stated the middle

school lockers are now red and completed. She updated the progress on the gym floors. She stated that there was some flooding in the Kindergarten wing when the storms came through, as well as some in the link and at the front of the high school. John Thiessen expressed his concern of possible mold in the carpet in the Kindergarten rooms that had some water. Dr. Steggall will look into germicide for potential issues. She gave an update on the ball fields at Perkins Park with completion set for August 9th.

## HVAC / Heating Units Bid

Dr. Steggall reviewed the bids for units at the middle school and high school. She stated that the lowest bid was from Summit Heating & Cooling in North Kansas City for \$49,838.

## Ellis Freezer Bid

Dr. Steggall reviewed purchases that have been made for the cafeterias. She then reviewed bids for a new freezer for Ellis. Dr. Steggall also stated that she is looking into new food service companies. She stated that the walk in freezer bid is \$28,222 from Arca Food Equipment.

Dr. Steggall stated that Brandon Burns had applied for a grant through the State of Missouri and the school received the grant. She reviewed the Blockchain grant details with the board. Discussion took place among the board.
