### Design Studio/CAPS Presentation

Mr. Lucas Delameter, Mr. Juan Rivera, Natalie Huke, Isaiah Howard, Tristen Miller and Mr. Brandon Burns all spoke about the things happening at the Tiger On Main store, sales are up students recently designed a t-shirt for Dr. Steggall's Women and Leadership Conference, the store now has a heat 2 heat press, which was used to screenprint the design onto the shirts. # Salary Schedule Handbook

Dr. Steggall stated that the recommendation is 3.8% increase for classified plus an additional \$1.50 increase to step one on classified salary schedule, and an increase of \$1,250 to base for certified staff bringing base to \$40,000 for the 2024/2025 school year..
